OVERVIEW

Are you interested in learning how to speak, read and write in Japanese? If you are 19 years or older, you are eligible* to register for Seneca's Japanese Language Skills part-time courses to achieve your goal.

Our comprehensive Japanese Language Skills certificate program examines various aspects of verbal and written communication — including an understanding of writing systems (Hiragana, Katakana, and Kanji), vocabulary, sound patterns and sentence structures — to help build proficiency and refine conversational skills in Japanese. You will also explore Japanese culture and social conventions, and participate in interactive, practical lessons designed to advance your personal and professional development.

Each course is 42 hours in total and is offered once a week in three-hour sessions for 14 weeks. Our courses are typically offered on weeknights and/or weekends to offer flexibility to our adult learners. Upon successful completion of certificate requirements, you will be eligible for a Seneca College Certificate in Japanese Language Skills.

LGE681	Themes in Japanese Language (three hours a week for 10 weeks, no textbook) - This is a conversation workshop.
