Udon うどん

Udon is a thick noodle made from wheat flour and used in various Japanese dishes. In its basic form, the noodles are in a bowl with a mild broth, called sobayu, made from dashi, soy sauce, and mirin.

Did you know?
Depending on what ingredients are cooked with the udon, this dish can take on different names such as Kitsune Udon, Tenjiku Udon, and Tsukemen Udon.

Taiyaki 鯛焼き

Taiyaki is a fish-shaped waffle snack made from major or panache or waffle batter, and typically filled with red bean paste.

Did you know?
Tai means "Red Sea Bream", a fish in which the snack was modeled after. Tai means "grilled", referring to the way it's cooked.

Dango 団子

Dango is a dumpling made from rice flour, mixed with starch (rice flour and glutinous rice flour). It is usually round in shape and are often served stacked on a skewer in groups of three or five.

Did you know?
Depending on what toppings this dish is served on or with, this dish can take on various different names. Some popular ones include Anko Dango, Cho Dango, and Tsunami Dango.

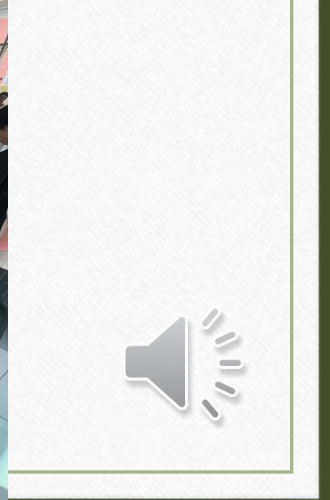

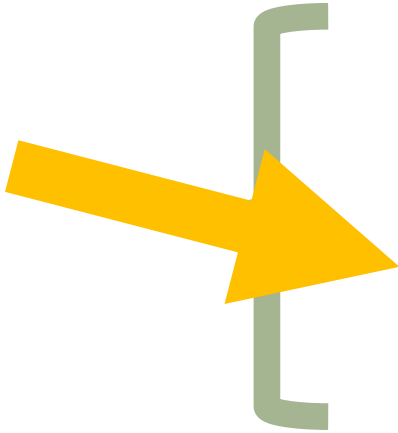
